Our main Clearing hotline opens from 7am on results day (**Thursday 14 August**), and our brilliant team will be on hand to chat through your options and help you secure a place that's perfect for you. When you call us, you'll speak to real people who care about helping you find the right course and making the transition as smooth and stress-free as possible.

I'll also be hosting a live webinar on **6 August**, where I'll guide you through what to expect on results

day, how to prepare for Clearing, and how the process works at Roehampton. You can watch this webinar anytime through our website.

So, if you're considering joining us this September, don't worry, we're here and ready to welcome you to the Roehampton community.

WHAT IS CLEARING? ISIT FOR ME?

What is Clearing?

Clearing is another chance for you to study at university this upcoming academic year. Clearing is not something to be afraid of, it is an opportunity for you to find a course and university that suits you and has a place available for you to start in September 2025.

Is Clearing an option for me?

If any of the following apply to you, you can apply through Clearing:

✓ You are applying after 30 June 2025

You didn't receive any offers, or didn't want to accept the ones you did receive

You didn't meet the conditions of your offers

You were unsure about going to university when applications were first open and didn't apply but want to start university this year

You did better than you thought in your exams and want to use the 'Decline my place' button to release yourself into Clearing

You have changed your mind about what course you want to study or which university you want to attend.

Have your grades already? Don't wait until results day apply through Clearing from 5 July and have your place at Roehampton confirmed.





USING CLEARING TO YOUR ADVANTAGE

Have you changed your mind about the course you want to study? Or want to attend a different university? Don't stress – it's not too late to change your mind.

You can decline your current place at a university and release yourself into Clearing so you can apply to a different university or course that has a place available (be sure to double check first).

This can all be done on UCAS Hub by clicking 'Decline my place' on your application. Self-releasing is a great opportunity, but make sure you have done your research first and are clear on what it means for you.

Results day

- On **14 August 2025**, A level, most BTEC and T Level students will receive their results. You can log onto UCAS to see if you have secured your firm or insurance choice
- If you haven't secured either of your choices, your UCAS Hub will tell you 'You are in Clearing'
- You should contact universities in Clearing directly to check if they have places available for your chosen course and if you are eligible to apply
- You can call Roehampton on our Clearing hotline: **0300 3038320**
- When you call, you will come through to one of our friendly Clearing advisors, make sure you know what course you want to apply for and have the following information in front of you:
- > Clearing number and UCAS ID number
- > Your grades
- > Course information (course code and name)
- > Personal statement and a few points about why you want a place
- > Pen and paper for note taking
- > Any questions you want to ask
- You can call and get as many verbal offers as you want from various universities, BUT you can only submit one official Clearing application on the UCAS Hub

Submit your Clearing application

- You can submit your Clearing application from 1pm on A level results day by clicking 'Add Clearing choice' on UCAS. Make sure you have spoken to the university and received a verbal offer first
- Keep an eye on UCAS to make sure the university confirms your place

'Embrace the now, the people around you and the resources from the university. Fill your free time, if you want to work with a camera, ask for a camera. It's all at your fingertips!'



Our beautiful campus is made up of 54 acres of parkland and modern facilities. We are surrounded by nature and greenery with Richmond Park next door. On campus you will find plenty of hangout spots including The Hive Café, The Union Bar, the Library Café and various canteens and social spaces across the university, as well as college kitchens for our commuting students. There is a shop on campus stocked with all the necessities.

Down Roehampton Lane you will find the King's Head pub, a Greggs, Morely's and Subway, as well as a local Co-op. There is also our local supermarket, ASDA, a short bus ride away.

In SW15

Putney High Street is our nearest high-street, with everything from H&M and Boots, to Wagamama's and Be at One. There are great charity shops, a cinema, supermarkets, pubs, and bars, meaning everything you need is close-by. Be sure to check out the Half Moon for some live music and comedy and watch the annual Cambridge versus Oxford Boat Race every spring.

Heading into central London

Hop on the train at Barnes and either straight to Waterloo and discover South Bank with some of London's most iconic attractions such as the London Eye, or get off at Wandsworth, Putney, Clapham or Queenstown Road (for Battersea Power Station) along the way. You can take the tube from Putney Bridge. Get on the District Line and head to Wimbledon or in the other direction, straight into central, getting off at Westminster for Buckingham Palace

Bipasha's Clearing success story

BIPASHA'S CLEARING SUCCESS STORY



We caught up with Bipasha, a BSc Biomedical Science student who came to Roehampton through Clearing.

Why did you apply through Clearing?

I applied through Clearing because I didn't get the grades I needed to study Biomedical Science at my original choice of university.

I came across Roehampton via the UCAS website, alongside other universities, but Roehampton was the only one in London with a direct commute from my house. That's why I ended up choosing it, and also because the Biomedical Science degree is accredited by the Institute of Biomedical Science, which many universities don't offer.

What did the process of applying through Clearing look like for you?

The process was quite straightforward. I submitted an online application form, and the following day someone from

Roehampton called me, asked me a few details about my qualifications and essentially gave me the offer. I then added Roehampton as my choice on the UCAS portal and waited for my email confirmation.

The person I spoke with was very patient and polite. I was quite stressed, so I liked the fact that it was a very quick process.

What would you say to someone applying through Clearing?

I would say try to not be too stressed, as Roehampton offers late Clearing too. Instead, focus more on deciding if the university or the course is right for you. Going to visit the campus is one way to check if the vibes match with you. Also, just because you're applying through Clearing, it doesn't make you less smart nor does it put you behind others, so always be confident in what you choose so you don't regret it for the next three years!



Stay calm, research well in advance, visit campuses if possible, and don't feel ashamed or rushed about going through Clearing- it can actually work out for the better!

What are your highlights so far at Roehampton?

My top achievements at Roehampton have to be being a programme rep in Year 1 and Year 2, and then school rep in Year 3. I also stood for elections for Vice President of Education—although I didn't win, I met amazing people who supported me throughout!

What has been your favourite memory here so far?

My best memory at Roehampton is being a student ambassador, no doubt! I met so many of my close friends through it. Representing the university in Higher Education fairs and open days has made me very proud, and I still don't see it as a job because everyone is so lovely and friendly. I will never forget the three amazing years as an ambassador.

Where do you hope your career will take you?

I hope my degree will take me to a clinical job where I can work alongside patients to support our community. I have already applied for the Internship Academy at Roehampton through the Student Futures team!



YOUR IMORE UP DATING YOUR INFORMATION HAVEN'T APPLIED

FOR STUDENT FINANCE YET?

If you are eligible, you can apply for a student loan to help with living costs and covering your course fees. The loans are only repayable once you graduate and earn a certain amount, so you don't need to worry about paying it back whilst you are at university.

Types of loans:

Tuition Fee Loan

- Your Tuition Fee Loan is paid directly to your university or college in three instalments during the academic year to cover your tuition fees
- A full-time student can get up to £9,535

Maintenance Loan

- This is paid directly into your bank account at the start of each term to help with living costs
- The maximum amount depends on where you live and your situation
- Living in London, away from parents, you get a higher loan

IF YOUR UNIVERSITY OR COURSE CHANGES

If you end up going through Clearing but have already applied for student finance, you will need to sign in to your student finance account and update your information. It is important to make these changes as soon as possible.

It's simple to do, just follow the below steps from GOV.UK:

1. 🖒 Sign in to your online account.

- 2. Select the application you wish to change.
- **3.** Under the heading 'Manage your student finance', click 'View and manage your applications'.
- **4.** Click 'Change your application' and then click again.
- 5. Click 'University/college and course'.
- **6.** Click 'Submit' once you've entered and confirmed your changes.

Placements tend to be a maximum of 13 months long. Once you've completed your placement year, you will then return to university to finish your final year of study.

My top tip to students is to tap into industries you are unsure about and take risks, as you may not know if you enjoy a particular industry. Furthermore, apply to placement opportunities, the experience you get by working in the industry for one year will put you ahead of the competition by miles when it comes to looking for a job in your final year. As you have grown your network substantially, it will open doors and help you stand out."

DUA'S CLEARING SUCCESS STORY

We caught up with Dua, a LLB Law student who came to Roehampton through Clearing.

Why did you apply through Clearing?

I applied through Clearing because I wasn't happy with the offers I received through UCAS. They were subjects that I wasn't really passionate about.

I made a list of the universities that were close to me and found out about Roehampton that way. Then I made the decision to call the university Clearing hotline and ask if they still had spaces. I eventually decided on Roehampton out of all my Clearing offers as it was the closest university to me, but thankfully the university itself ended up really suiting me as well!

What did the process of applying through Clearing look like for you?

Clearing was stressful at times, but the Clearing lines were very swift and the people I talked to were all really lovely and willing to help! They helped me to identify what I needed and made the application process smoother.

What would you say to someone applying through Clearing?

Make sure you stay calm and be prepared. It might feel stressful, but it's worth taking your time to make the right decision for you.

What are your top tips for Clearing?

My top tips for Clearing would be to make sure you have the official UCAS Clearing website open and jot down a list of all the universities you're interested in applying to which have Clearing spaces for the course you're interested in. Then, make a list of their entry requirements and Clearing hotline numbers so you can easily call them one by one when Clearing opens on results day (that's what I did and it helped a lot, I'd say it saves a lot of time).



Some highlights for me would be getting the opportunity to be a student ambassador, being a module rep, getting to take part in archery (my favourite hobby), and meeting wonderful people during my time here so far!

What has been your favourite memory here so far?




