Digby Stuart College is part of a global network of schools, colleges, and universities across the world who were all created by the Society of the Sacred Heart (RSCJs) - a women's Catholic religious congregation founded in France in 1800.

The founder of the Society of the Sacred Heart, St. Madeleine Sophie Barat, was driven by a desire to heal the pain and division in her country in the aftermath of the French revolution. She chose to do this primarily through a combination of education and spirituality, and especially through the education of girls and women.

When the Society of the Sacred Heart expanded their mission to England in 1874, Digby Stuart College was founded as a centre to train and inspire women who would go on to serve in education as teachers and leaders.

With these foundations, Digby Stuart College is proud to be a part of the Sacred Heart Schools and College Network in England and Wales. Alongside our 5 schools, we aim to educate the whole person, committing to each student's spiritual, intellectual, and personal growth. We support our students to flourish as they play their part in building up our college community, holding the integrity and dignity of all members at its core. We encourage each member of our community to develop their social awareness and act in a way that is compassionate, reflective, and always in the pursuit of Justice, Peace and Integrity of Creation.

**Valuing Intellect** - encouraging our students' academic potential.



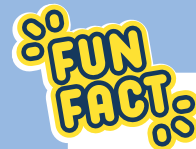
**Social Awareness** - promoting social justice and positive change-making.

Meeting new people is an integral part of being at uni, and we want everyone in Digby Stuart to be able to make friendships that will last a lifetime!

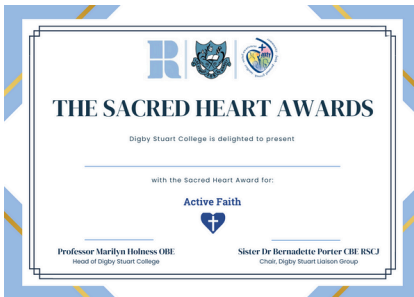
Here are just some of the social events and activities you can take part in as part of our College community:

You can also **book the Diner** in the evenings for society and group events - please contact Sarah (College Staff) for more information and a booking request form.

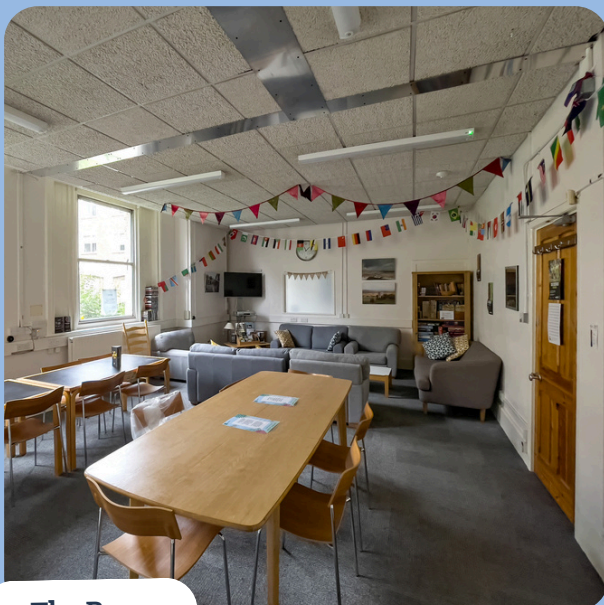

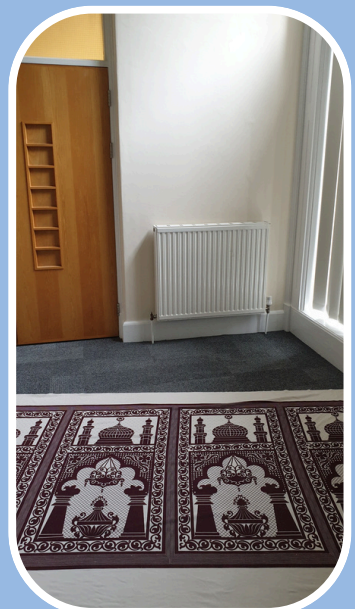

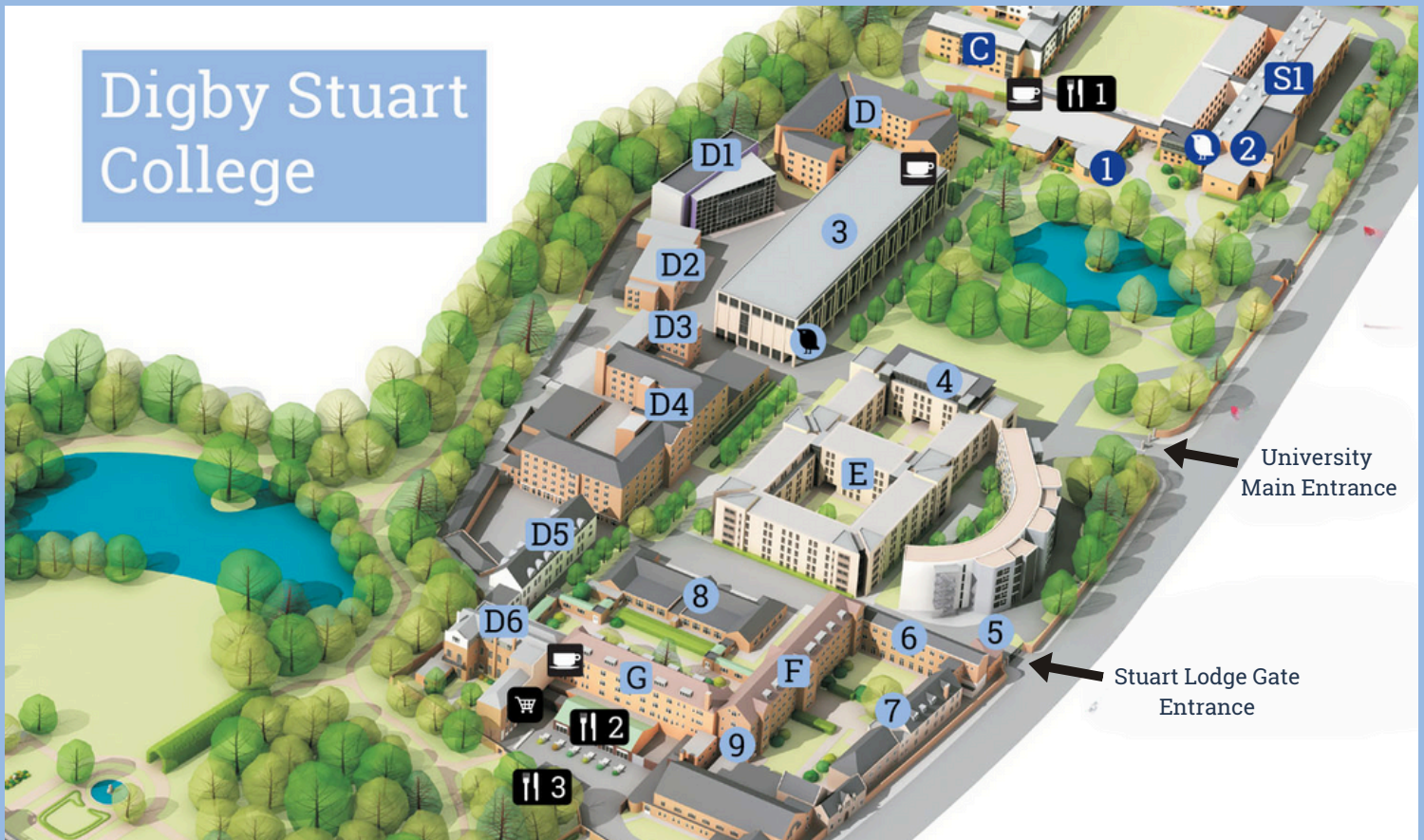
# Student Code of Conduct

4. I will use social media and online platforms thoughtfully. I'll communicate respectfully and avoid sharing anything that could harm others or the university's reputation.
5. I will respect consent and protect privacy. I'll make sure I understand what consent means in all contexts, and I won't record, share, or alter images, videos, or audio of others without their clear permission.
6. I will take care of shared spaces. I'll help keep communal areas like the library, classrooms, and accommodation clean, safe, and welcoming for everyone.
7. I will follow safety rules to protect myself and others. I'll respect fire safety equipment, follow evacuation procedures, and avoid any behaviour that could put people at risk.
8. I will communicate in a professional and constructive way. Whether I'm sending an email or raising a concern, I'll use respectful language and aim to build understanding.
9. I will identify myself when asked by university staff. I understand that sharing my name and ID when reasonably requested helps keep our community safe and accountable.
