	Introduction (10 mins)	<u>Icebreaker:</u> Quiz about personal statements (See presentation) Explain to students that the aim of a personal statement is to sell yourself. Discuss the other parts of the UCAS application e.g. Education and how what they put in those sections e.g. grades may affect what they write in their personal statement e.g. not including grades.			
Teaching & Learning	Development (40-60 mins)	grades. Act 1: Talking Personal Statement - Student in pairs and three's answer the three questions giving specific examples. Ask the partners to give feedback to the stude on how to make their answer more concise. Act 2: Learning your ABCs & Case Studies - Teach students the ABC method (similar to PEE / PEEL essay writing method). Remind students of the important of linking all th statements back to their course. -Look at the Usain Bolt case study. Have the student write an AB from Usain Bolt if he were applying to Sport Psychology. Ask stude what skills may be useful in Sport Psychology.
